The Mite Experience

As life slowly resumes in many countries, over 100,000 new cases of COVID-19 have been reported every day worldwide. In many countries people have been laid off from their jobs and are struggling to provide the basics for their families.

In Haiti: With a population of 11.2 million, we are still only at the beginning of the COVID-19 epidemic, with a total of 4,000+ officially diagnosed cases and more than 80 deaths recorded, according to the latest official report from the health authorities. The experts fear more than 20,000 Haitians will die from Coronavirus.



Since March 19, a state of health emergency was declared in the country of Haiti, leading to the implementation of several measures including recommending systematic hand washing and wearing a mandatory mask in public places. While schools, universities and churches remain closed, most people are forced to return to their economic activities because unemployment insurance does not exist in Haiti. Even before the onset of the health crisis, the UN already estimated that more than 40% of Haitians needed emergency humanitarian aid, and the unemployment rate was already as high as roughly 70%!!!



If you take a look at this one small part of a mountainside in a city in Haiti, you can see why social distancing is not even a remote possibility in that area, and how quickly the disease can be passed from one person to another. The country's medical system is not able to cope with a massive influx of patients. The solution therefore consists of reducing the risks of contamination while allowing citizens to continue working. So, at Water For Life, we had to slow down some of our other projects to focus on providing clean water through water well drilling and the pump repair program. As a matter of fact, from March through May 2020, we have been able, thanks to your support, to drill 34 new wells and repair 159 existing wells to provide or restore water to a total of more than 67,550 people. Now think of the more-than-1,900 wells drilled by Water For Life that are pumping water today! We estimate that more than 665,000 people are able to drink good clean water today, thanks to God's faithfulness and people's generosity. Praise our mighty God!

Unfortunately, more than 60% of people living in remote areas of Haiti still do not have access to the clean water they need that would allow them to wash their hands systematically in order to control the spread of the virus. We remain in an emergency state and continue to receive such a quantity of drilling requests which we cannot fulfill due to lack of financial resources. We are very aware of the financial crisis all over the world. However, we have nowhere else to lift our eyes other than to the Lord Jesus Christ and His disciples for prayer and financial help for the Haitian people. We appeal to your generosity to continue to empower them to protect themselves from the virus by providing them with access to water for hand washing.

May the Lord say to all of you what He said to this poor widow in Mark 12:43, "... Truly I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the offering box."

No Worries in Jesus!!!

As we are writing this article, all over the world, someone is crying over the death of a loved friend or family member hit by the Coronavirus. In Haiti, we are sensing it as a growing storm raging and taking lives daily. If you know Haiti you can imagine the amount of stress, fear, and anxiety we are experiencing as we are counting daily the ever-growing numbers of people being infected by the virus and multiple dozens of deaths. The healthcare system in Haiti even in normal times is very inadequate and really not ready to face such a daily-growing disaster.

At Water for Life we want you to know that we keep praying for you, and we are also counting on your prayers to strengthen us in our faith in Jesus' promise in Matthew 6:25, "So I tell you, don't worry about everyday life..." v.27 "Can all your worries add a single moment to your life? Of course not," said our Lord Jesus.

In Haiti we have nowhere else to turn other than to the Word of God; in Psalm 121:1-3 we are told, "I look up to the mountains; does my help come from there? ²My help comes from the Lord who made the heavens and the earth! ³He will not let you stumble and fall; the One who watches over you will not sleep." (NLT)

In the midst of this storm we are still experiencing the faithfulness and compassion of our God through His faithful servants to the needy people of Haiti. The staff of WFL in Haiti and Iowa, on behalf of the people, want to express our gratitude to all of you who have made it possible to keep serving the people for over 35 years.

We want to say a special thank you to all of you who have contributed to buy the new rig and water truck, those who have paid for the shipping and insurance, the longtime friends who organized a fundraiser of barbecued chicken that allows us to pay the custom fees in Haiti, and all of you who keep contributing to buy casing and all the other needs. Your sacrificial contributions in this time of recession and financial crisis are worth a lot, and have been such a blessing.

May our Lord Jesus lift your gifts to the Father, multiply them and provide for the of thousands of people in need of water, health, food and education.
