Water- Essential after a disaster



The angel answered [Cornelius], "Your prayers and gifts to the poor have come up as a memorial offering before God." Acts 10:4(NIV)

In the wreckage of her home patched with tin, this young girl from the town of Buteau in Port Salut, severely hit by Hurricane Matthew, is hauling water from an open-source well. A well open to contamination from the soil and the floods, exposing her and other family members to diseases such as typhoid, cholera, leptospirosis, hepatitis. Port Salut was one of the areas that had a cholera outbreak in the days following the hurricane. Some even lost their lives.... one of God's precious lives, lost because of no access to clean water.

The after-math of a natural disaster presents dangers often equivalent to the disaster itself, compromising human health and hampering socio-economic activities in the community. This can result for in even greater poverty, with households finding themselves forced to go further into debt to rebuild their homes, replant their fields (with no seed saved from the last crop), and take care of the sick from the waterborne diseases.

Water For Life pump repair teams have conducted emergency repairs to damaged pumps by the hurricane, ensuring that people are drinking safe water.

You can help those who've lost everything to maintain health, get their lives on track by providing them with a source of safe drinking water from a well.

People should be allowed to drink clean water and preserve their bodies from deadly waterborne diseases.

Your donation towards the pump repair program has made it possible to maintain and repair the pumps that provided clean water to the people.

A dire situation for women



Léonie, 22, is amongst the many women that came for obstetric and gynecological screening at the mobile clinic held at Labady, a locality of La Colline d'Aquin in December. About 4 months pregnant, she is very sad; she just learned the baby she was carrying had died in her womb, probably due to non-treatment of pelvic infectious disease. She needed to go immediately to the hospital to save her life. She would deliver a dead fetus instead of a healthy baby, after suffering for many hours.

In Haiti many women die due to complications of pregnancy and child birth because there are few obstetric care facilities available, especially in rural areas. Almost all of these deaths occur in low-resource settings, and most could be prevented if they would have access to a proper pre-natal care. Léonie's baby's life would likely have been spared if she had had better access to pre-natal care.

Your donation helped 128 grateful women to access a gynecologist/obstetrician, many for their first experience with a specialist, having their first sonogram at our mobile clinic. These women received medication for infections, as needed, and counseling and meds to improve nutrition-- anemia prophylaxis.

Other reproductive tract problems such as cervical cancer are increasing among young Haitian women, claiming lives. With your help by supporting the cervical screening and treatment program, you can save a young woman's life, sparing young children from becoming orphans, and allowing young women and mothers to have better healthier lives.
