In most rural villages in Haiti many children and adolescents are still denied even a basic education, leaving many in darkness of illiteracy while school-aged populations continue to grow, closing many doors for a better future.

The children of Paswadòm have been blessed through your generosity with a Christian school teaching excellent academic skills on a strong Bible base. This year again the school has a high success rate made possible through the support of the teachers that dedicate their time and hearts to instruct the children wisely. Recruiting enough qualified teachers is crucial to such success. Quality teachers do not just improve test scores; when combined with adequate didactic material they have long-term positive effects on the socio-economic status of children 20 and 30 years down the line.

Unfortunately, some children were not able to afford books and school supplies for this year which explains why they failed in some classes. On behalf of these children whose families are facing great economic difficulties, we request your support in prayer and donations so they can still benefit from education. The Children of Abraham

“Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham. Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: “All nations will be blessed through you.” So those who rely on faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.” Galatians 3:7-9 (NIV)

As the WFL mobile medical clinic visited the village of Abraham, mothers and grandmothers came with their children suffering from flu, diarrhea, etc. hoping for relief for their little ones, saving the costly trip to the district town clinic.



Many Haitian mothers and children do not have access to medical care. Lack of prenatal care contributes to increased infant and maternal mortality. Relying on subsistence farming for their livelihood, a sick or injured family member often becomes disabled and a burden for the family.

With hard-to-reach geographical distances to cover, the public sector health supplies don't reliably reach rural areas where most live, outside the district towns.

Children die for lack of medicines for common easily treated childhood diseases; they die from the lack of knowledge of basic hygiene and care principles by their mothers.

Health and hygiene education is an important part of the clinics that you help sponsor. Educating moms on the importance of hand washing and basic do's and don'ts in cases of diarrhea along with distribution and instructions on how to use Oral Rehydration Salts can save a child's life. We call upon your generosity to continue to reach out to more people; our needs are great for medicines, for baby layette bundles, toothbrushes and tooth paste, medical equipment.... Needed: A Well Closer to Home



Looking in deep into those eyes we have a glimpse of the reality of this 7-year-old girl at Larivye Kizin in Petit Goâve, Haiti.

When we went to visit the well, we were immediately attracted to this child. She was very tight-lipped, wearing a serious face, unlike other children who came noisily to draw water from the new well. We didn't get her name. Some villagers admitted that most of the time she was called "Hey you!"

Her silence hardly concealed her harsh reality. Beside all the other chores she has done, this little girl has to walk 45 minutes alone to this newly drilled well in a neighboring village, which is the only reliable water source for the people of the whole area.

In poor rural communities the hours spent collecting water are long and children are deprived of their freedom, childhood, education, fun and play, and natural social and physical development. Childhood should be a period of learning, recreation, and physical, mental and social development. Collecting water from long-distance sources delays the possibility of schooling and affects educational performance.

Her eyes tell us her story, a cry for help. And she is not alone; many children in Haiti are in the same position, that of being like little slaves living away from their parents. You can change the sadness in eyes such as these into bright and hopeful smiles by contributing towards a well.

Let's make kids like her feel that someone cares. The hardship of living far from good water can be washed away by donating funds for a well closer to home.
