1 Peter 1:3 (NIV).

It is always sad to meet hopeless people in the face of disturbing situations encountered, either in their personal

From Leon's Desk

Greetings to all our wonderful friends! I am so thankful to know so many of you who have been a part of helping the people of Haiti in many ways. I love the verse in Isaiah 63:7—*“I will tell of the kindness of the Lord, the deeds for which he is to be praised, according to all the Lord has done for us.”* (NIV) This certainly is what I want to do all the days of my life. The Lord blessed me with many unique stories, and I'd like to share one of them with you: this happened when we lived in the village of Paswadòm, and the people relied a lot on us to help them get to a hospital—whether an accident or a birth, that sort of thing. This time it was for a birth. It seemed like most births happened at night, or maybe those are the ones we found out about! So one night someone knocked on our door and told us their wife was in labor and needed to go to the hospital. I got over to their place to pick the lady up. We had a sturdy SUV-type vehicle with a back door. They brought some sheets along and she lay there in the back as we took off for the 20-mile [2 hour] trip over terrible roads for most of the way. One other person went along (not the father). I didn't want to go overly fast to make her more uncomfortable than she already was on the one hand, but I did want to get to the hospital before she gave birth! I could tell by her groans that labor was progressing. When we were over half-way to our destination I could tell we weren't going to make it, and sure enough the other rider said, “You'd better stop.” I stopped, went back and jerked open the door, and basically caught the baby! It all happened so fast! We wrapped up the baby, gave her to her mama to hold and continued to the hospital. We arrived around 1 am and the doors were locked tight. I rapped on the gate till someone finally came and after several minutes we were able to drive in. A wheelchair in pretty bad shape was brought out for the mama to ride in. I walked alongside her, holding the baby who was still attached to its umbilical cord. Well, they got the baby taken care of, and after a bit all of us were on our way back home. The mother was so thankful I'd been able to help in her time of need that she insisted I be the godfather for her child. So I was able to watch the child grow up over the years.
