God's Spirit at Work

After Hurricane Matthew severely hit the South of Haiti, almost all agricultural households suffered and are still suffering from considerable food deficits and inability to cover the minimum of their primary needs without exhausting their livelihood assets.

These losses worsened the economic situation of those people who were already living in extremely difficult conditions.

So it was with relief and deep gratitude that the Pasbwadòm community welcomed two American groups helping them increase their irrigation capacity. This project will allow the use of much more land for the production of plantains and other vegetable products for the benefit of more than 120 families of farmers.



We thank God for coordinating everything for His glory. In February, our faithful volunteers were able to work several days to install 5000 feet of 6" PVC in a trench dug by local farmers of Pasbwadòm. Altogether, with both donated supplies and services, beneficiaries are working to restore hope in the heart of a whole community. Over 180 new acres of land will be available to be irrigated to produce food for local consumption and trade, along with what is already in use. In Haiti, the agricultural sector is one of the main sources of employment and income- generating activities. When you contribute in irrigation projects you also help equip thousands of fathers and mothers to assume their role and thus strengthen the Christian values in Haitian society.

Thank you for showing compassion to our people, remaining united by the Holy Spirit.

Among 1055 men, women, and children who benefited from our medical mobile clinic in the community of Dory, Maniche, South of Haiti, Fisia Fleurzil, 33 years old, was the great miracle of this event! Arriving at the clinic, with no pulse and hardly perceptible blood pressure, Fisia was in shock. With professionalism and compassion the medical staff quickly evaluated her. Fisia was suffering from a ruptured ectopic pregnancy, a life threatening condition, the diagnosis being confirmed by sonography.

She was immediately transported to the state hospital located 1 1/2 hours away from the village. Promptly, the lady was taken to the operating room for surgery.



Three days later, Fisia was recovering very well from her surgery. Yet she remembers the night spent in suffering without knowing to whom to turn because her village had no functional health center. She is so grateful that God allowed her to miraculously survive her life-threatening condition so she can take care of her husband and 11-year-old son.

In Haiti's remote villages where there is no access to health care, many women would not have had Fisia's outcome. Haiti still remains the country with the highest rate of maternal mortality in the Caribbean. We praise the Lord that, thanks to your support, Fisia is more than a statistic!
