Access to Drinking Water a Daily Miracle



Faces so radiant usually bear witness to joy that only extraordinary events can provide. And yet, for these children and women in remote villages in Aquin South of Haiti, small details are lived tirelessly as a miracle—that of being able to use a water pump located less than a mile from home.

By supporting the construction of water wells in remote places in Haiti, you bring the joy of life to thousands of women and children for safe drinking water; basic sanitation and good water management are essential for health.

Nearly one-tenth of the disease burden could be avoided by improving access to drinking water, according to the World Health Organization (2018).

In addition to saving lives, other benefits include improved productivity, educational progress and savings in health care.

Every Life Counts

Health conditions of the Haitian population living in rural areas remain very worrying, as all health indicators show:

- Life expectancy at birth: 59.5 years
- Maternal mortality: 623 / 100,000 births
- Under-5 mortality rate: 120 / 1,000 children

- Number of doctors: 25 / 100,000 inhabitants
- Number of hospital beds: 1.44 / 1,000 inhabitants
- Public health expenditure: 3.9% of total government budget (2017-2018)



Hopefully, this deficiency does not affect the national territory uniformly, and primarily affects the remote areas that are often untouched by any health facility. Statistically, 40% of the rural population does not have access to conventional health care.

At each mobile clinic that you support with your money and prayers, hundreds of people receive health care.

In view of the immense health care needs in Haiti, these activities could seem insignificant, but every life counts and deserves to be preserved.

On behalf of hundreds who flock to the mobile clinics every six weeks to relieve their health problem, we say thank you.

There are about 140 preschoolers at the Water For Life Divine Help School in Pasbwadòm Haiti, and 99% of them come from families that still struggle to meet their primary needs.

Some parents do home gardening, while many others make charcoal; many parents have never been to school themselves.

And yet, these folks consent to great sacrifice to send their children to school, for between food and other daily expenses, there is not much left for school fees.

In very large families, children go to school intermittently. Whoever had the chance to go to school last year may well have to forfeit their turn this year.

Fortunately, God has sent His guardian angels to the rescue of these poor children. Indeed, through the School Sponsorship Program many children can stay in school now.


