God Has Made Provision

God has been so good and has used so many of you, making it possible for us to now have a third well rig and water truck to go out and drill more wells. Thank you ever so much!! Now these big trucks are out of customs, with the required license plates, and are hard at work. Praise God!



Over two billion people around the world lack access to safe drinking water within 30 minutes from their home, while in Haiti the share of the population with access to potable water decreased from 62% to 52%! (World Bank 2019) Forty-eight percent of the rural Haitian population still must walk over an hour to reach an often unprotected and contaminated water source.

And yet, water is the most important component of the human body: on average it constitutes 60% of our total body weight.

As we all know, water is essential for maintaining our physiological functions. Hydration is a vital but often overlooked health need. Early exposure to water scarcity could affect the development of the unborn fetus. Dehydration may impair our immune defenses as poor hydration may increase stress hormones, such as cortisol, that are involved in regulating the immune system. Dehydration also reduces levels of saliva and tear fluid, which contain antimicrobial proteins that are involved in immune defense.

In remote areas of Haiti, despite all the efforts already made, hundreds of thousands of people still must drink contaminated water from rivers, lakes, and shallow holes in the ground. We are all aware of the consequences of consuming

germ-infested water. Currently at St. Jules, Fond des Blancs, the community is facing a terrible epidemic of dysentery (diarrhea and fever). Dozens of people have been hospitalized every day. Overwhelmed by this alarming situation, the director of the hospital came to our office to ask for help and to see how a few sanitary wells in their area could be drilled to save the population.

With your prayers and your financial support, we believe that God will make provision. Water For Life is ready to go not only to St. Jules but also to many other villages to bring drinking water as well as the life-giving water of the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Please do not hesitate to share with your family members and friends about this great need and encourage them to contribute to this project to rescue these neighbors of ours.
