These health care professionals, doctors, dentists, nurses and pharmacists make the choice of closing their private practices to serve the needy for 3 days through the mobile clinics.

Volunteering to provide care and comfort to those who do not have access to health care facilities, they passionately and faithfully move forward to the achievement of the 12th mobile clinic to be held in La Vallée/Jacmel, South East of Haiti where, thanks to donors' generous contribution, 25 wells were drilled and 4 solar pumps were installed.

Dear Friends of Water For Life,

My name is Arun Pereira and I am the president of a Christian leadership organization named Gospel Haiti; we are in the middle of praying and looking at the possibility of partnering with Water For Life for an emergency project in the area of Forêt-des-Pins (Pine Forest), Western Haiti.

Forêt-des-Pins is one of the last remaining forest area in Haiti. The elevation is about 6,000 ft high. One challenge in this area is that it is completely dependent on rain for farming and all living needs since there are no rivers, springs or wells. Collecting rain water and storing in cistern has been the way people functioned in this area.

Over the past few years, rain has been scarce in Haiti



In Pine Forest, many thousands of people eagerly await the insufficient water truck to satiate their thirst, knowing for a fact that each day, only 500 of them will receive 5 gallons of that precious commodity.

Over the past few years, rain has been scarce in Haiti but it has been particularly harsh in this region. Last year, the summer harvest was very poor due to the lack of rain. Over 80% of the people were not able to harvest due to the lack of rain.

The situation reached a whole new level of gravity. After the dry season, the rain usually starts again around March. April - June it will usually rains every day for hours. However, this year, March and April went by with no rain. People's cisterns started going dry around March. In May of this year, the situation reached a critical and extreme stage. Even after walking for 2 to 4 hours, people still were not able to find water. We heard many reports of animals dying in a nearby town. In that town, there were also reports of a few people dying.

As I write this letter, it is June 12th and it has only rained 4 times. This region is truly a very fragile place due to the lack of water. Providing water through trucks is only a temporary solution and it cannot be sustainable in the long-term. We also tested the water from the nearby spring and the hand dug wells in this area, and almost all the places showed traces of cholera bacteria. We realize that the area needs a safe and reliable source of water.

Over the past two months, we have been talking to the leadership of Water For Life about the possibility of drilling for the wells in this area. After they visited this area and saw the need first-hand and have seen this urgent need for water, they are considering coming here to drill, even though this region is very far from their area of activities. This will truly be a challenging project. The elevation, location, and the fact that the nearest source of water is about 5-6 hrs walking distance poses serious challenge. It implies that many of the wells will be deep wells which will need to be powered by solar panels rather than by hands, which, in turn, increases the cost of their work. Maintaining these wells is also a challenge. Regardless of those challenges, WFL is still considering coming to this area. We realize that they will need much prayers and financial resources.

I thank God for you all for being part of Water For Life. Your financial contribution is what makes their work possible. I can tell you from firsthand knowledge that the people of Water For Life have been sacrificially serving in Haiti by providing clean water in some of the most needy areas of Haiti. We are grateful to God for the opportunity to partner with WFL.

The above letter exemplifies how great the needs are, perhaps more so than ever before due to increased drought.
