Sponsor a Child, Heal a Soul



We are pleased to introduce Smiraldo. He is 10 years old and benefits from our School Sponsorship Program.

Because you have contributed to the education of children in Pasbwadom, this little boy has access to professional counseling that helps him fight against the Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) he is experiencing. Indeed, when he was only 3 years old, his mom died in the earthquake in January 2010. He owes his life to a neighbor who dug him out from under the remains of the house they were living in. His father abandoned him in the aftermath of the earthquake, and he was relocated to live with his god mother.

Even though he is still in second grade, Smiraldo keeps improving. His gaze is no longer that of someone with an overwhelmed sense of sadness and hopelessness.

"This sponsorship is a gift from heaven, as I know Christian teachings that my godson is receiving will cast away those terrible nightmares he is having all night long," said Smiraldo's godmother.

Now, the child can take advantage of an educational environment that allows him to escape from the mutism where he locked himself up when the painful memories of his childhood resurfaced.

Thanks to a sponsor, his stolen childhood has been re-claimed, and a better future is on the way!

As a hard working mom, Elouse always did everything she could to meet the needs of her family. Her faith in Jesus Christ always allowed her to overcome the countless trials that littered her path.

After several years of savings, she bought a piece of land and slowly built a roof over her children's heads. Despite all the difficulties associated with being single mother, Elouse had created a stable environment for her daughters to grow up in, until Hurricane Matthew came last fall and destroyed her small world.

Eighty per-cent of her house was turned into debris, and she resolved to relocate at a friend's house with her family.

Her friend was willing, but the house of refuge was already too small for the family who lived there, let alone a second family! Before long, conflicts began to arise, forcing Elouse and her

Thirst for Water... Thirst for Education



Here is Fabrice; despite his being only 12 years of age he carries on his frail shoulders the heavy responsibility to supply his home with water, and this at the cost of his schooling.

Perched in the heights of Arniquet, Southern Haiti, his village, named Kaysera, has no source of drinking water.

Frequently, the water found is not drinkable. To be potable it must be boiled or treated, difficult to do due to scarcity of resources and the precarious economic situation of the villagers. With the consumption of contaminated water, young Haitians' health is at high risk. Diarrhea, often resulting from the consumption of these waters, is one of the major causes of mortality in children under 5.

In order for him to find clean water, every morning and every afternoon, Fabrice must saddle the family donkey and go down the dangerous rocky path leading to the neighboring village of Mont Gerard which, thanks to the generosity of a faithful donor, has recently received a hand-pumped water well. So, leaving before dawn on the back of his donkey, these journeys of two hours one way twice a day consume much of the time Fabrice should devote to study.

Deep down, the young boy feels torn between his desire to spend time in school and his responsibilities towards his family. However he is still happy to spare his younger brothers and sisters by sacrificing himself to this task.

He hopes that one day a well will be drilled in his village. Then he and many other kids won't have to go so far to fetch water and miss school anymore.

By helping drill a well in a remote village of Haiti, you fulfill the dream of many poor kids like Fabrice in providing for their thirst of clean water **and** education!
