Walking by Faith in Times of Desperation

In a spirit of hope the people of Haiti welcome the year 2022. Year 2021 was a nightmare for Haitian families. Despite the damage of an earthquake and storm, the Covid virus, the lack of basics such as water, food, electricity, healthcare, etc., the people must also face every day the high risk of death, kidnapping, rape, torture and so on. In many cases families lost all they had to pay ransom to kidnappers often only to receive in return the mutilated dead body of their loved one. Is Haiti at war with another nation? It is very disheartening to see that all the pain, suffering and misery are inflicted by Haitian brothers and sisters who are supposed to help one another.

In the midst of such sad circumstances, we want to say **THANK YOU** to our Water for Life staff for risking their lives to keep serving the people during these difficult times. By the grace of God, in 2021 we drilled 82 wells, but eight were dry or salty, leaving 74 good wells providing clean water to approximately 26,000 people.



The pump teams repaired 558 pumps in 2021, allowing 195,300 people to keep drinking clean water and keep their bodies safe and in good health.

We are especially thankful for the WFL school staff at Passe Bois d'Orme, who serve our 621 students by providing good academic Christian education and a daily hot meal!

The Mobile Clinic team twice faced the dangerous road leaving Port au Prince to serve two villages that had great medical needs, serving 1,180 people. Six people recovered their sight due to the cataract surgery program that you help us fund.

We praise the Lord for the board members and administration staff in Iowa and Haiti who faithfully and wisely steward the resources.

All of this was possible by the love of God in the hearts of our prayer partners and financial supporters through their sacrificial and unconditional donations to the people of Haiti, expecting nothing in return except to demonstrate the calling and the love of God. We praise the Lord for you.

On behalf of the Haitian people, we say **THANK YOU** to you all and we praise the Lord for putting us together as His Church to fulfill the word of God in Isaiah 61:1-2a and Luke 4: 17-21. We believe that God has the power to bring brighter days here and we are happy to be, together, a part of His plan.

Luke 4:17-21 says this:

¹⁷and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to [Jesus]. Unrolling it, He found the place where it is written:

We highly appreciate our staff in Haiti; we'd like you to get to know them too! Each plays a specific role as a part of our team, although our drilling and pump repair teams have cross-trained. Our plan is to introduce a member of our team to you each month. The first person who's been interviewed is a member of a drilling team. His name is Claude Guerrier and he has been part of our team for more than six years.

- Q: How do you understand and appreciate the mission of Water For Life?
- A: The main mission of WFL is to demonstrate the love of Christ. All Water For Life activities are like a chain where everyone depends on each other to accomplish the mission. Each person and each function is important.



I appreciate the fact that WFL is exactly like a chain of solidarity (from donors to technical teams in the field, without forgetting the administration team) that works well to help the population.

- Q: How do you understand your participation in this mission?
- A: My mission is to use my skills to do what God expects from me, which is to help people in need with my little means, and WFL allows me to do it even more.

Interacting with people in the field allows me to show the love of Christ. As I am on the ground for drilling activities, I am one of those whom people see, and I have the responsibility to represent WFL.

So I have to be motivated in all circumstances. There may be obstacles that confront the team members. For example, the drilling team may encounter hostility from some people; in that case it is necessary to know how to react well, with wisdom, respect and love. But we are also blessed to see a lot of hope and gratitude in people.

- Q: What impact has this mission had in your life?
- A: My mentality has changed, even at home my way of speaking and treating others has improved. I only get positive things out of it; God is great and I see it every day in the field.
