Let's Talk About Hope

Jeremiah 29: 11 says, "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Hebrew 6:19a tells us, "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure..."

When Jeremiah sent his words of encouragement to God's people, the situation seemed hopeless for them. For many years, Israel was in exile, living under the control of Babylon, a pagan nation, with only memories of their beloved country. But God had not abandoned them; even better, He had great and unexpected plans for them.

The same way Jeremiah's words lighted again the flame of hope for Israel, in Haiti we are encouraged each day when remembering Jesus Christ's grace.

We believe that He will never abandon nor forsake us. We believe that each time we drill a well, providing people water essential to their lives, we show them there is a reason to hope!

Last week, we visited an area where people waited for a well for a long time. When we arrived, the people quickly gathered around us. Faces were emaciated and tired, and bodies seemed marked by the hard work of the earth. They were mostly farmers with small gardens, having very difficult access to drinking water or to farm. Can you imagine their reactions when they heard that Water For Life would actually come back to drill in the following days? They were hopeful, joyful and thankful for that precious gift and could experience the goodness of God through His servants.



We thank you for your faithfulness in prayer and your sacrificial donations that allow us to keep on bringing hope and showing the love of our Lord and Savior!

Madame Masilienne, shown in the next picture, is one of the beneficiaries of the newly drilled well. She lives in a semi-rural area that has been waiting for this for a long time.



Head of her family, struggling every day to meet the needs of her loved ones, she tells us about their situation before and after the well:

- Q. How did you access water before?
- A. There was a hand-dug well in a person's house that we depended on. Unfortunately the well did not provide enough water for the whole community. It was also physically difficult because we had to pull water up in buckets by rope for our families, our animals and everything we needed.
- Q. Today, how many people in the community benefit from the well?
- A. At least a hundred people from the immediate area, and now many new people come from further afield to take advantage of the well which gives good drinking water.
- Q. What would you like to say to Water For Life and the family who sponsored this well?
- A. We send you a thousand thanks! It has changed our daily lives, and we ask for health and blessings for you and for your family. Ephesians 2:10 says, "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (NIV)

We ask you to pray that we find water at each borehole we drill.

Because where there is water, there is life!
