Take Heart and Wait for the Lord

Several weeks ago, in an area called Pestel, the drillers and the population of the area experienced great disappointment. After trying with great difficulty to drill a well in the area, we had to give up. The extremely hard rock gave way to underground cavities which made it impossible to continue.



The team left the area with sadness.

A few days later, we had two drilling teams that started working on a community multiple-well project in the department (state) of Nippes.

In a few days, 11 wells were drilled without major difficulty. None exceed 200 feet and all have between 10 and 60 gallons of water per minute. What a joy for the populations concerned! And what encouragement for the drillers and for us!

Already, and despite the past months being so difficult, we will have drilled as many wells in 10 months as in 12 months last year. Glory to God!

Through the challenges we see every day in Haiti, the Lord encourages us to wait on Him.

Psalm 27:14 says: *"Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord."*

Sometimes when a well is dry in one place He reminds us that further on He has made provision so that we can provide access to abundant water.

End of One School Year, Preparation for Another

This year the school summer vacation will be shorter for the young students of the Divine Help School of Passe Bois d'Ormes.

Usually the school closes for almost two months in the summer, but because of the late resumption of classes (not until last December) there will only be one month to make all the preparations for the next school year.

We ask that you accompany us in prayer for the following:

- May the Lord allow the children and the school staff to rest during this break
- That we can manage the preparation as well as possible (repairs and small improvements in the school, inventories, purchases of materials, cleaning, etc.)
- May the Lord continue to dispose the hearts of teachers, supervisors and all school staff so that they continue to engage with the students with skills and love
- That the school can reopen its doors in September, for a year without disruptions!

- Q. When did your story with Water For Life begin?

FYI: You may have noticed last month that while we drilled eight wells, only one new pump was installed. For June it's even worse. There's a reason for that—a number of months ago, we ordered new hand-pumps and parts from India, to be delivered by container to Haiti. Those containers have been held up in customs, causing us to run out of needed parts for new installations and more pump repairs. **Prayers needed! We hope to have a better report next month!!**

You are not giving up sharing God's love to the people whom you don't even know. That is truly God's love flowing through you to so many people who need His love in this very difficult time in Haiti! Supplies are harder to get, prices of supplies and for shipping are double and triple what they used to be. We have containers in customs that should have been released weeks ago, but we are still waiting. So pray that the containers are released from customs because we need the supplies in them! On the good side we are so thankful for being able to keep reaching out and touching thousands of people.
