Perhaps you recall that after the terrible tragedy of the January 12, 2010, earthquake where several hundred thousand people lost their lives, that a cholera epidemic soon followed, affecting more than 352,000 people in 2011 alone, taking the lives of thousands. Cholera largely disappeared since then; no cases at all were reported for the past three years.


Unfortunately, it has once again resurfaced in the past several months in Haiti, and we see every day that the epidemic is spreading, causing more and more deaths.

Only access to safe drinking water can help the population effectively fight the epidemic. In Haiti, the need for drinking water is still enormous.

Heartbeats From the Field: Jean-Claude Michard, Deputy Educational Director at Divine Help School

- Q. When did your story with Water For Life begin?
- A. I had a classmate from my studies in Les Cayes who had become the director of the Divine Help School. She told me about the school and suggested that I submit an application, which I did in August 2010. That year, the road was really bad. I remember that the day I went



to submit my application, it was raining. I fell off my motorbike, into the mud, and I arrived all dirty! I lived very far from the school (around two hours) and I had no place to stay in Passe Bois D'Orme. Finally in April 2011, I met a contact from my childhood town, with whom I was able to stay until I was able to rent a place of my own. I started working at the school at that time.

- Q. How do you understand and appreciate the mission of Water For Life?
- A. I was able to appreciate the mission of Water For Life by seeing the situation of the population improve in relation to access to water. The school has saved several generations of people. If it hadn't been for this school in this deprived area, I don't know what would have become of these children.
- Q. How do you understand your participation in this mission?
- A. My mission is to work to enable children to receive quality Christian training. It is important to give them knowledge and transmit to them the values of the kingdom of God.
- Q. What impact has this mission had in your life?
- A. I learned to be a more disciplined person. The Divine Help School values the Word of God, and I am happy to work in an establishment for which its slogan is "for God we train our children."
