LIFE LEARNING CENTER is a new Water for Life ministry in the village of Charrier, adjacent to the WFL compound near Les Cayes, South of Haiti. This ministry, like all of our other ministries, is to fulfill the last command of our Lord Jesus before ascending to the Father in Acts 1:8—"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (NIV)

As the Lord had commanded us to do in the area of Passe Bois d' Orme (our Jerusalem) for the past 40 years through our well drilling program, the Divine Help School and the church, LIFE LEARNING CENTER's purpose is to continue with the same mission to witness and demonstrate the love of God through our Lord Jesus Christ to the children and families of the village of Charrier (our Judea) and fulfill the word of God in Acts 2:42. We are doing it through different activities such as Christlike family and community relationships, premarital and family counseling, and an after-school program for the children: assistance with their school homework, Bible teaching, foreign languages, computer, agriculture, and sports.

Resumption of the Cataract Program

Mr. Buteau is 59 years old, and he could no longer see much. This greatly handicapped him in every aspect of his daily life. Recognizing people, moving around or carrying out specific tasks became very complicated for him.

The first blessing for him was that during a Water For Life mobile clinic, he was able to meet an ophthalmologist and learn that his illness was not irreversible, as he'd assumed. Mr. Buteau suffered from severe cataracts in both eyes.



The second blessing was Water For Life financially supporting an operation that he could not have afforded, and accompanying him throughout the process.

The ultimate blessing: the operation is a success! Mr. Buteau finally sees the contours of life redrawing, and he is truly grateful for that.

- Q. When did your story with Water For Life begin?
- A. I didn't know about WFL. A friend who had volunteered for the Mobile Clinics told me about it. At that time I was not in Les Cayes, but I was interested in joining the list of volunteers when I returned.



When Edy invited my friend to visit the Life Learning Center and then share its vision, she immediately told me about it. I met Edy and came once to speak to the kids at the center. I really liked the concept, the fact of mentoring young people from disadvantaged backgrounds and helping them to start life better. I started getting involved as a volunteer every Friday at the center. I am a general practitioner and I always knew that I did not only want to consult and see patients, but also defend a cause and in particular the cause of children.

- Q. How do you understand and appreciate the mission of Water For Life?
- A. WFL's mission is to serve others with the goal of sharing God's love the same way Jesus did. This mission of sharing God's love applies to beneficiaries even in remote communities, and also inside the organization. When we join WFL we join a workspace of course, but different from the others; everyone acts with kindness and when we recruit a new employee, we emphasize the vision of WFL.
- Q. How do you understand your participation in this mission?
- A. From my point of view, WFL gave me an opportunity to do something else than practicing clinical medicine. I believe that I am accomplishing more of what I have in my heart within my mission for WFL. At the end of the day, thanks to this mission I feel that I am useful to others. My mission is really aligned with what I wanted to do.

Whatever challenges I may encounter personally, I therefore carry out all the activities assigned to me with professional conscience, a sense of responsibility and with love so that the beneficiaries feel that this is also what we are transmitting.

- A. Thanks to this mission within WFL, I see others with much more kindness.
