Heartbeats From the Field: Pastor Beaulière Sené

When did your story with Water For Life begin?

Water For Life is the organization that I was in touch with since before the year 2010. I used to make many trips to Puits Salés with Pastor Eris Labady for ministerial activities, when I began to see children pumping water from wells and many banana farms in the village of Passe Bois d'Ormes, like an oasis in a desert. It is at Puits Salés also that I met Leon and Joy Miller for the first time, the leaders of this organization that provides water to drink and for irrigation. After the

Haiti earthquake of 2010, Edy was helping Leon and Joy to move the mission forward when he invited me to join the WFL team. I immediately resigned from my position at Parole et Action (Word & Deed), another international ministry where I'd worked for 22 years, and accepted his invitation, answering



so quickly because I felt called by the Lord to continue to serve Him through this new team, with new challenges to face and new objectives to achieve.

How do you understand and appreciate the mission of Water For Life?

I understand the mission of Water For Life is to demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ to everyone who touches our programs, like drilling, pump repair, Mobile Clinic, school, leadership activities and so on... Employees don't work like they're just doing a job but always do their best to show love to people that they serve. This philosophy is oxygen, or the breath, in the life of the organization, from the Board to the last employee in the chain. I don't see a better way to demonstrate the love of Christ to people who are in big need.

How do you understand your participation in this mission?

My participation in this work keeps in me the feeling of the accomplishment of Matthew 25:40. *"Give a cup of water to thirsty people."* Providing pure drinking water to millions of poor people, the irrigation of hundreds of acres of land for farmers, giving quality education to hundreds of kids and healthcare to the sick in the countryside of Haiti, is meeting real necessities of thousands of human beings otherwise forgotten.

What impact has this mission had on your life?

The philosophy of Water For Life continues to inspire me, to encourage and to increase more and more my motivation to demonstrate the love of Christ to others, when I'm serving them, as a servant leader, as a true disciple of Jesus Christ.

From Leon's Desk

Greetings to all our wonderful friends! The days and months keep moving by so fast! Spring is here now, and it is such a beautiful time of year; to see how new life appears on this earth bringing fresh color with it is so wonderful! It reminds me as a believer that new life in Jesus will bring the joy of the Lord out through us.

Also, celebrating Easter after commemorating Jesus' sacrifice for each of us is mirrored so well in nature as we see so clearly what new life looks like! Let's remember also His promise that one day He will come back and receive all who've already accepted Him as Savior and Lord into His perfect Heaven where there will be no more tears, no more sorrow or injustice or sin of any kind. Praise the Lord!

In Haiti, things are not calmed down yet. This is in Port au Prince and surrounding areas mostly, plus now several towns north of there. We have a load of 5" well casing waiting in customs; we pray it can be released soon! There are some days that those who work there cannot even get to work due to gang activity. We also have hand pumps and pump parts from India on order, which will need to be shipped and then go through the customs process also. Please be in prayer for these, so that people can continue to be served.

Proverbs 3:5,6 tells us to "*Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths.*" We count on Him to do so!

School is going well. Recently there has been a bit of rain, so that makes it more difficult for the children to get to school. The farmers, of course, are delighted!

The challenge of keeping our two pump repair trucks in working order affects our ability to keep the pumps repaired. They are somewhat behind at the moment; we desperately need to ship another pump truck to Haiti for this task. We are working on a solution to this.

Joy and I were in Haiti for a week at the end of March. We were able to go to Cap Haïtiën rather than Port au Prince to connect with a smaller plane that took us to Les Cayes. It felt so much safer! It was wonderful to see our co-workers once again! They are doing well, but please keep them in your prayers! We certainly want to thank Sarah for all her efforts on behalf of Water For Life for these last three years. May God bless you, Sarah, wherever He may lead you!

Thank you so very much for your prayers and financial support; both are needed to keep the ministry afloat. So let's stay in touch and keep praying for each other. God bless you all.
