Opportunities Without Borders

In September 2024, Life Learning Center launched *Opportunities Without Borders (OWB)*, a bold initiative aimed at equipping young people and adults with practical skills in technology and language. The program was born from a simple



but urgent truth: many high school graduates in Haiti lack the financial means to pursue university or vocational training. By offering accessible education, *OWB* opens doors to employment and personal growth, empowering learners to build a future beyond traditional barriers.

Since the launch of *OWB*, we have witnessed a growing wave of enthusiasm and hope. More people are joining our initiative, eager to learn and to grow. What began as a simple idea has become a vibrant movement, one that proves that when opportunity meets determination, borders disappear. Today, three classes: beginner, intermediate, and advanced are running successfully. Around thirty students are part of this journey of discovery, each one learning not only new skills but also the confidence to dream bigger.

Life Learning Center & Divine Help School

This academic year has been filled with encouraging results and renewed motivation.

At *Life Learning Center*, the 9th grade students we have tutored achieved an exceptional *100% success rate* in the national exams. Their dedication and discipline shine as a true example of what commitment can achieve.



At *Divine Help School*, 26 out of 27 students passed their 9th grade exams, an outstanding *96.3% success rate*. In High School (12th grade), 18 out of 21 students succeeded, giving us *85.7%*, a reflection of perseverance and hard work. These results are more than numbers. They tell stories of effort, resilience, and faith from students who keep pushing forward, from teachers who never give up, and from families who believe in the power of education.


