"My name is Sonide Moise and I live in Demion. In the past, it was very difficult for us to find drinking water. We used to rely on water from a canal meant for agriculture and livestock. The animals drank from it and left their waste in it. We had



no other choice but to use that water.

When the canal ran dry, we had to walk more than four kilometers to fetch water. It was a real struggle.

Today, we are filled with joy thanks to the donation of this well. We are deeply grateful to the donors, and we also give thanks to God for this blessing."
